A short **walk** on a **rain forest trail** brings you to the spectacular adventure park where expert guides will outfit you with the proper safety equipment and instructions. Then you're off to enjoy the thrill of the **ropes course** and **zip-line** experience.

Start by entering an incredible series of ropes course crossings, including Burma loops, a suspension bridge, and a raised balance beam. Next up is a fantastic series of six zip-lines through the lush Alaska forest canopy. As you zip from platform to platform, fellow participants cheer you on. Leaving the Skagway crowds behind, join the Hess Family and discover Haines, the hidden jewel of Alaska, just 15 miles (a 40-minute fast-ferry ride) away from Skagway. The small town of Haines is as close to Northern Exposure as you can get without the television script. Your tour begins in Skagway and takes you on a journey into the 48,000-acre Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve for a wilderness adventure among towering mountains, hanging glaciers and unspoiled nature. You will view massive bald eagle nests and the possibility of sighting moose in their natural habitat is very good. You will access the roadless portion of the Preserve in a specially designed, flat-bottom riverboat, and travel miles of different channels of the Chilkat River. This boat is designed for this silt-laden river, and is equipped with eco-friendly four-stroke outboard motors, so the guide is usually able to hold against the current or turn around and go back to give you the best photo opportunities, should you spot eagles or other wildlife. The animals are used to the boats as this tour has operated in this eco-system for 22 years. The boat is uncovered for better wildlife and scenic, photographic opportunities, but extra jackets and large waterproof, windproof lap blankets keep you warm and dry on your adventure. Join your hosts at their private property with modern restroom facilities. Enjoy an old-fashioned hot dog roasted over the open barbecue and sample fabulous Chilkat Valley chili as you relax in the heated pavilion or sit by the campfire and visit with your hosts and fellow adventurers. You will return to Skagway with a greater respect for nature, Alaska and the residents who call this rugged wilderness their home.



This trip combines an impressive 27-mile rail journey on the 'Scenic Railway of the World' and a five-mile round-trip wilderness hike to **Denver Valley** among the lush old-growth forest of the Denver Valley.

Your adventure begins with a 22-mile coach drive up the Klondike Highway to Fraser, BC. From here, a splendid ride aboard the White Pass & Yukon Route Railroad -- complete with waterfalls, rushing rivers, trestles, and tunnels -- carries you through White Pass as you trace portions of the original Trail of '98, as well as outstanding views from Inspiration Point. Leave the train at Denver Station; then, a short safety briefing and gear-up will prepare you for your forest adventure.







On the way down, you will stop once again at an exclusive mountaintop lodge to enjoy a warm fire, stunning views and a home-cooked halibut and chicken lunch made just for you. After you've relaxed by the fire, make your way back down to the trailhead to climb aboard the Takshanuk Trail bus. Enjoy a short tour of Historic Haines and Fort William H. Seward before returning to your ship on the high-speed catamaran.

Driving the machines is based on availability. Guides do their utmost to ensure individuals who would like to drive have the opportunity to do so. Minimum age to drive is 21 years; bring your driver's license. ### White Pass Bennett Lake Adventure


The wilderness beckons you on this 67-mile journey aboard the historic White Pass Railroad to remote Bennett Lake. Step back in time and explore an abandoned gold rush town on a self-guided walking tour; then, dine on a hearty prospector's lunch.

Begin your day by traveling via motor coach to the **White Pass & Yukon Route Railroad**shops, where you will board the **train** for a spectacular 67-mile northbound trip. This is Alaska's famous historic railway leading to Fraser, British Columbia, and on to beautiful Bennett Lake. Accessible only by train, Bennett, BC is an abandoned town. Constructed during the Klondike Gold Rush, Bennett was located at the end of the White Pass and Chilkoot Trails -- a vital stop for prospectors on their journey north to the gold fields. Back in the day, thousands of people constructed boats and rafts here to launch across the lake and down the Yukon River. Today, you will sit down in this idyllic setting to enjoy a hearty, traditional prospector's **lunch** of piping hot, gold miner's stew, sourdough bread and apple pie. Explore this magnificent area on a self-guided walking tour after lunch.

Re-board the train for the next leg of your trip. You're headed to Carcross -- a contraction of the town's full and correct name, which is Caribou Crossing. After exploring the Native village, meet your motor coach for the scenic journey down the Klondike Highway and back to Skagway. The White Pass & Yukon Route is unlike any other railroad. Against all odds, this iron trail was carved through some of the North's most rugged terrain in 1898. Built during the Klondike Gold Rush, this engineering wonder is an International Historic Civil Engineering Landmark -- an honor shared with the Eiffel Tower, the Panama Canal and the Statue of Liberty. Considered an impossible feat, the railway was completed in 26 months by literally blasting through the mountains with 450 tons of explosives. The 110-mile railroad was completed when a final golden spike was hammered into place on July 29, 1900 in Carcross, Yukon. On board, you'll climb nearly 3,000 feet over 20 miles of steep grades and cliff-hanging turns. Relax in vintage rail cars as your train agent retraces the original route to the White Pass Summit, passing Bridal Veil Falls, Inspiration Point and Dead Horse Gulch. Enjoy a breathtaking panorama of mountains, glaciers, gorges, waterfalls, tunnels, trestles and historic sites. See the original Klondike Trail of '98 worn into the rocks -- a permanent tribute to the thousands of souls who passed this way in search of fortune. Notes:

This adventure crosses the US/Canadian border; US and Canadian citizens must carry a passport and ship ID. All other nationalities must have a valid passport, visa and ship ID. Written consent is required for children traveling into Canada without both parents. Vegetarian lunch available with at least 24 hours notice. This tour may operate in the opposite direction.

Marvel at the chain of lakes that form the headwaters of the Yukon River, explore the rustic town of Caribou Crossing (Carcross). Snap a quick photo of the world's smallest desert, and enjoy the tales of the Klondike Gold rush provided by your guide throughout your journey.

A stop at **Caribou Crossing Trading Post** is an opportunity to satisfy your wilderness appetite with a delicious chicken barbecue **lunch** complete with Grandma's all-you-can-eat **homemade donuts**.

Tour Yukon's most extensive **Wildlife Museum**, strolling among the creatures of Yukon's past and present, with favorites including steppe bison, grizzly bears, monster moose, woolly mammoth, and the world's largest mounted polar bear. Absorb some authentic Canadian culture with Caribou Crossing's newest exhibit -- the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Heritage Center. This interpretive display focuses on the history of Canada's Mounties and highlights their role in the Yukon Territory during the Klondike Gold Rush.

At the **Dog Musher's Village**, visit with Iditarod dog mushers and take pictures with sled dogs and husky puppies; or, for an extra fee, join them for a dog-cart ride with actual Iditarod and Yukon Quest dogs. Kids and adults alike will enjoy the petting farm.

Back at Fraser, British Columbia, you'll board the **White Pass & Yukon Route Railroad** for a truly unforgettable ride down this historic and breathtaking narrow-gauge track. Notes:

First you'll board the historic **White Pass & Yukon Route** narrow-gauge railroad for an incredible 1½-hour trip through the coastal mountains to British Columbia, Canada. Meet your professional guide, versed in the ecology and history of the area, who will then take you for a short van ride along the scenic Klondike Highway to the summit of the White Pass. After a bicycle and safety orientation, it is **15 scenic miles downhill** from the summit to the sea. As you coast along the paved **Klondike Highway** on this 1½-hour bike ride you will make multiple stops for photos of the historic White Pass & Yukon Route Railroad, cascading waterfalls, awe-inspiring glaciers, majestic mountains, and other historic sites. Your senses will awaken to sights and sounds of Alaska that can only be experienced on two wheels. You will even ride your bike across the US border.

After this thrilling ride, enjoy some **free time** in historic **downtown Skagway** before heading back to the ship.

Your journey begins at the pier where you'll board a motor coach for a narrated drive through historic downtown Skagway en route to your first stop. It continues with a scenic drive up the Klondike Highway, paralleling the White Pass & Yukon Route railroad and peaking at the breathtaking **summit of White Pass**, some 3,290 feet above sea level.

At the first stop, the Yukon Suspension Bridge, you will walk across a custom-built footbridge dramatically suspended over the rapids of the Tutshi River. Explore museum-quality exhibits and enjoy the fresh mountain air. There are plenty of photo opportunities of spectacular scenery at this breathtaking vantage point.

**Lunch** includes organic Wild Bison Chili, ciabatta bread, salad, coffee, tea, juice, soda and Yukon Gold beer.

Traveling back down the scenic Klondike Highway you'll arrive at your last stop of the day -- at the Red Onion Saloon Brothel Museum, splendidly costumed madams greet you with a souvenir garter. Delight in provocative tales of Klondike Kate, Diamond Tooth Lil and other enterprising women who worked at the Red Onion in 1898. The madams share hilarious stories of the saloon's more recent, but no less intoxicating history, as they serve you an ice cold **Alaskan Amber**. Step upstairs to the celebrated brothel museum and explore the hallway, bedrooms and priceless artifacts left behind by the 'soiled doves.' Have your photo taken with one of the madams; then, feel free to stay and have fun at the saloon or ride back to the ship by coach.
