WHALE QUEST & ORCA POINT LODGE

Juneau, Alaska Tour Code: JNU_66

This exciting tour combines a “whales guaranteed” cruise with Alaska’s finest wilderness salmon bake. Following a motorcoach ride to scenic Auke Bay, you’ll board a waterjet-powered vessel specially designed for wildlife viewing. Relax in the warm, comfortable cabin, surrounded by large windows, as you ply the island studded waters of Stephens Passage. This area is world-renowned as a favored summer feeding ground for humpback whales. Once whales have been sighted, your skilled Captain will maneuver the vessel to allow exceptional viewing and photographic opportunities, as these graceful giants slowly arc their massive tail flukes into the air. Don’t forget your camera, and be sure to bring a warm jacket to wear on the topside observation deck.

The whales are often close enough to hear them breathe! An onboard naturalist will explain the behavior and habitat of the humpback whale and other wildlife you may encounter, including killer whales, Steller sea lions, Dall's porpoise, harbor seals, bald eagles and more. The operators of this tour guarantee you'll see a whale. If not, you'll receive a \$100 cash refund as you disembark the vessel. Don't anticipate a refund; in the past 10+ years, whales have been sighted on every tour!

Then take a leisurely break from cruising to step ashore at Orca Point Lodge on beautiful Colt Island and enjoy a feast that includes fresh grilled wild Alaska salmon, chicken kabobs, corn on the cob, rice pilaf, coleslaw, fresh hot rolls and desserts. The lodge offers peaceful seclusion with modern comforts in a remote wilderness setting. Be sure to wear comfortable walking shoes and take a stroll along the beach before boarding the vessel for your return cruise to Auke Bay.

Note: Dress warmly and bring a rainproof jacket to wear on the vessel observation deck and for enjoying the natural environment at Orca Point Lodge. MENDENHALL GLACIER, HATCHERY & GARDENS

Juneau, Alaska Tour Code: JNU_02

This comprehensive tour offers the highlights of Alaska's capital city including a visit to stunning Mendenhall Glacier. Board your deluxe coach and set off to explore a selection of Juneau's most memorable attractions in style as your driver/guide shares tales of Juneau's colorful past. Arrive at the Macaulay Salmon Hatchery and the staff will acquaint you with one of Alaska's most important species - the Pacific salmon. Be sure to check out the raceways with adolescent salmon and the various aquariums displaying the rich sea life of the region.

Next, travel to Glacier Gardens. Relax as a guide ushers you through the rain forest to the 800 foot level via motorized cart where you'll have time to take in a canopy view of Gastineau Channel below and Douglas Island, Lynn Canal, Mendenhall Valley, and the Chilkat Mountains in the background. Your tour culminates with a visit to Mendenhall Glacier. The area offers several vantage points for viewing this stunning river of ice.

Explore the visitor center to learn about this Ice Age wonder from the engaging exhibits and visiting with U.S. Forest Service staff.

MENDENHALL GLACIER & GARDENS

Glacier Gardens Rainforest, nestled alongside Thunder Mountain, is a stunning combination of flowered pathways and temperate rainforest. Enjoy a guided tour from your covered transportation into the rainforest. Your guide will provide a narrative through the mile long journey to the 580 foot level. Enjoy breathtaking views of the Mendenhall wetlands, Gastineau Channel and Admiralty Island from the viewpoint on Thunder Mountain.

Continue to Mendenhall Glacier, a moving river of ice with rugged crevasses and a distinctive blue color. Stroll the walkways to the Visitor Center, take in an exhibit, an interpretive talk with a Forest Service Ranger or simply enjoy the panoramic view of the glacier.

GOLD CREEK SALMON BAKE

A short, narrated bus ride brings you to Salmon Creek, the outdoor site for your salmon bake. Listen to live Alaska folk music while you dine under translucent, heated domes shielding you from the elements. Enjoy an all-you-can-eat feast. Savor Alaskan caught wild salmon barbecued over an open alder wood fire accompanied by chicken, potatoes, baked beans, wild-rice pilaf, a variety of salads, combread, lemonade, coffee, tea, hot apple cider, hot chocolate as well as blueberry cake for dessert. Beer, wine and soda are available for purchase.

Stroll through the woods and roast marshmallows over the campfire . Take a short walk along Salmon Creek, a salmon spawning stream, to a breathtaking waterfall. Here you can also explore the remains of the historic Wagner Mine and try your hand at gold panning. Stop by the Trading Post to browse and shop for Alaskan items.

Note: Umbrellas for walk to waterfall and gold pans are available for use on site. Buses depart regularly to the pier so you may return at your leisure.

FAMILY FUN GOLD RUSH

Juneau, Alaska Tour Code: JNU_04

Learn about mining, pan for gold and garnets and keep what you find. This is a fun and educational experience that the entire family will enjoy. Depart the pier for the brief drive to Sheep Creek, site of the ruins of the Alaska-Gastineau Mill, once the world's largest producing gold mill. Put on your hard hat and ear plugs and venture inside the 360 foot long conveyor tunnel carved into the mountainside. Inside, an experienced miner will demonstrate some mining equipment and give you a feel for the mining lifestyle – tailored to a younger audience. Once outside, you'll find spectacular vistas and photo opportunities of Gastineau Channel and Douglas Island.

You'll make your way back to the mill site, where you can explore the ruins, displays, assayer's office and gift shop. You'll also have the opportunity to pan for gold and garnets and keep what you find. A special art station is provided for children to build a mining landscape that they can take home with them. Relax around the campfire and roast marshmallows at your leisure. Children are also provided with a souvenir miner's helmet and a certificate. Your driver will update you on the mining industry's current role in Juneau before returning you to the ship.

Note: Dress in layers, as underground temperatures tend to be chilly.

SEA KAYAK ADVENTURE

Juneau, Alaska Tour Code: JNU_28

Your kayak adventure along Juneau's coast begins with a short drive by bus to North Douglas Island, where you'll enjoy scenic views of the Mendenhall Glacier. Here, your guide will hand out life jackets and rain gear before teaching you paddling techniques. Board the two-person kayaks, with your travel companion or assigned partner for your breathtaking trip, which will give you a sense of how Aleut Indians traveled the coastal waterways.

The stable yet nimble kayaks will allow you to silently approach any wildlife in the area, including porpoise, seals, sea lions, eagles, herons, or even whales. Explore the Mendenhall Wetlands and view the spectacular Mendenhall Glacier. Your guide will entertain you with stories about Smugglers Cove and the history of the surrounding area. Back at the kayak base; enjoy a tasty snack before the journey back to port.

Note: Participants must weigh between 40 and 260 lbs. and be in good physical condition. Paddling duration is approximately 1 1/2 hours. Life jackets and rain gear are provided. Passengers over 6'3" will not be able to steer with foot pedals and will be without a rudder. A motorized boat is used to discreetly follow guests in case of emergencies or injuries. This tour will operate in all weather conditions - wear warm clothing. Souvenir hats, t-shirts and jackets are available for purchase at the end of the tour. Not recommended for guests who are in their third trimester of pregnancy.

ALASKA'S ULTIMATE CANOPY & ZIPLINE EXPEDITION

Juneau, Alaska Tour Code: JNU_36

Board a high speed vessel for a Gastineau Channel crossing passing Mayflower Island and Suicide Falls, with a beach landing at the remote Treadwell mine site on Douglas Island, with direct access to the forest outfitting base camp. Your professionally trained guides will outfit you with state of the art safety equipment and provide a detailed safety briefing. Then be transported by a 4x4 Unimog all-terrain vehicle up the densely forested hillside to the first zipline tree platform. This is your introduction to nearly a mile of high tension cables linking a network of platforms mounted high in carefully selected old growth spruce trees. Your guides will progressively ease you into the forest canopy.

Cross aerial suspension bridges with breathtaking views of spectacular Bullion Creek and towering views of Juneau from the tree tops. Discover hidden ruins of the historic Treadwell Mine (1881-1917), once one of the world's largest gold mines and zip over a 150 foot deep "glory hole". You'll have an opportunity to explore the ruins of the original mine refinery, where millions of dollars of molten gold was poured into ingot molds. The last zipline transports you to the base camp, where each participant receives a light snack and is presented with a custom cast Alaska Canopy Adventures medal, in recognition of their achievement. An informative narration is provided on the channel crossing. Throughout this nature based adventure, you'll be surrounded by the sights and sounds of Alaska's rainforest.

Note: Participants must be at least 5 feet tall and weigh at least 80 lbs and no more than 250 lbs. Guests must be in good overall physical condition with full use of limbs and be able to follow instructions in English. All guests must wear closed-toe shoes. No video cameras allowed while zipping.

Then join a dog handler and sled dogs for interactive demonstrations on mushing equipment and the impeccable care the dogs receive.

Your dog handler will also entertain you with knowledge about the training, history, races and inspiring efforts required by this sport. Admire the untamed beauty as you walk across a suspension bridge overlooking Fish Creek. This camp is surrounded by moss-covered forest with huge spruce and hemlock trees. Then cuddle up with a husky puppy and take your picture with one of these adorable future athletes! This excursion is the perfect mix of Alaska's culture, history, adventure, rugged wilderness, and of course sled dogs and puppies. Complimentary refreshments are provided.

ALASKA'S WHALES & RAINFOREST TRAILS

Juneau, Alaska Tour Code: JNU_57

Juneau is a spectacular place of diverse, natural habitats from valley glaciers, to temperate forests and natural fjords. Traveling in a small group, this exploratory journey introduces you to this pristine wilderness with a certified Naturalist Guide as your leader. Whale sightings are guaranteed on this small group outing combining a marine exploration with a gentle hike on a secluded rainforest trail.

Your trip begins with your guide sharing stories as you travel out to the trail head on North Douglas Island. A short hike takes you through old growth forest, musk keg, and out to a scenic beach. Spend an hour exploring under forested canopies and sweeping glacial landscapes. This small corner of the Tongass National Forest is home to beavers, eagles, salmon, porcupines and black bears.

Following a short drive and a picture stop with the Mendenhall Glacier in the distance, you'll climb aboard an exploration vessel specifically designed for up close wildlife viewing. The customized covered watercraft puts you eye-to-eye with the marine life that thrive in these protected waters. Humpback whales, orcas, sea lions, porpoises, seals and sea birds are commonly seen. Keep a camera handy to capture the behaviors of these marine residents.

Note: Participants must be able to walk on their own for over an hour covering approximately 1.5 miles on level trail. Infants must be carried in an infant backpack. We recommend you dress in layers and wear sturdy, comfortable walking shoes. This tour operates in all weather conditions. Raingear, bottled water and a snack pack are included. Liability waiver required to be signed in the presence of the tour operator.

Whale sightings are guaranteed or you'll receive \$100 cash back as you disembark the vessel. All tour participants on this excursion are eligible to enter the tour operator's Capture Juneau Photo Contest and win cash prizes. Seeing glaciers from the air is an Alaskan must, and doing so by authentic Alaskan bush plane is the quintessential Alaskan experience!

The Taku River will be your "runway" as you land at the elegantly rustic historic Taku Lodge, built in 1923 and located across the river from the 5 mile wide Taku Glacier, Juneau's largest glacier and one of only a few advancing glaciers in the world. The Taku Glacier Lodge is on the National Register of Historic Places. Here, savor an all-you-can eat feast of fresh wild Alaska King Salmon grilled to perfection, a chicken alternative, Taku baked beans, coleslaw, pioneer fruit compote, fresh herb biscuits and sourdough bread all made from scratch. Drinks are chilled and served with actual glacier ice and special recipe ginger cookies complete the meal. The scrumptious aroma of the alderwood grill attracts not only visitors daily, but also wild black bears. Take a guided interpretative nature walk, stroll the trails or soak in the serenity of a place barely touched by time before your return flight to Juneau. You can do it all with this exclusive combination tour of Alaska's premier attractions!

Note: Flight time is approximately 50 minutes. All participants enjoy a window seat for enhanced viewing and a headset for continuous narration.

5 GLACIER SEAPLANE EXPLORATION

The grandeur of Alaska's epic glaciers will thrill and delight you on Juneau's only five glacier flightseeing tour. This is a must do Alaskan experience, seeing glaciers from the air on an authentic Alaskan bush plane. Your seaplane exploration begins as your aircraft gently takes off from the historic downtown waterfront carrying you over Juneau's mining past. En route, you'll soar over the lush wilderness of the Tongass National Forest until your first glimpse of five distinctly different majestic glaciers making up the 1,500 square mile Juneau Icefield.

Glide over the deep crevasses and azure blue melt water pools of the Norris, Hole-In-The-Wall, East and West Twin Glaciers, plus the famous five mile wide Taku Glacier. Of the 36 named glaciers comprising the Juneau Icefield the Taku Glacier is the only one that is actually advancing, not retreating - one of only a few in the world. Make sure to bring your camera to capture the magical memories of this trip. All participants enjoy a window seat for enhanced viewing and a headset for continuous narration.

On this unforgettable journey, you may find Alaska's unique glaciers in different stages - advancing, retreating, cascading or a one-of-a-kind floating glacier.

After flightseeing over these amazing glaciers, your pilot will gently land on one of these ancient rivers of ice. Under your pilot's expert guidance, you'll get the chance to walk on an Alaskan glacier and explore the ancient landscape.

Note: Participants must be at least 2 years of age. Flight time is approximately 35 minutes, with an approximate 15-20 minutes landing on a glacier. Although the glacier landing is not wheelchair accessible, guest will remain on board the aircraft with the doors opens to enjoy a scenic view of the glacier. MENDENHALL GLACIER BY HELICOPTER & GUIDED WALK


Juneau, Alaska Tour Code: JNU_18

Flying high above wetland habitat, Alpine ridges and lush rainforests, you'll gain new appreciation for this rugged land as your pilot shares a lively narrative. As you approach the icefield and its many glaciers, you'll marvel at the twisted spires, deep blue crevasses and carved peaks that make up this ancient landscape. Soaring even higher, you may pass the Mendenhall Towers jagged rock sentinels that climb more than 7,000 feet and the spectacular icefalls that overflow to form the Mendenhall Glacier.

View icefalls, spires, and the many hanging glaciers suspended on the surrounding mountainsides before a gentle landing on this slowly moving river of ice is made so that you can explore the glaciers' surface with your expert glacier guide. 



Soar by tramway up to 1,800 feet above the city to take in one of the most expansive and beautiful views in Alaska. Once at the top of Mount Roberts, you'll find that the Nature Center is the starting point of an extensive trail system. Your optional hike includes observation platforms in the rainforest and Alpine meadows.

At the Mountain House, you can watch a complimentary film, Seeing Daylight and also browse and shop local artwork at the Raven Eagle Gifts and Gallery. Here, you can also witness a Tlingit artisan as he carves. Food and beverages are available for purchase at the Timberline Bar & Grill. The Goldbelt Mount Roberts Tramway is a family, friendly attraction, suitable for all ages and abilities.

Notes: Tickets allow unlimited rides throughout the day and reservations are not required. There is no charge for children 5 years of age or under. Should you have a ticket and the child is under 5 years of age, please go to the Shore Excursion Desk on board the ship and return the ticket, so your not charged. Tickets cannot be returned at Mt.
