MISTY FJORDS & WILDERNESS EXPLORER

Ketchikan, Alaska Tour Code: KTN_14

Explore Misty Fjords, one of nature's most spectacular creations while cruising in luxury aboard one of the fastest sightseeing vessels in Alaska. The adventure begins as you leave Ketchikan's picturesque harbor, passing by colorful fishing boats and floatplanes, in route to a wilderness experience you'll never forget. Enjoy first class service and an informative naturalist's presentation and watch for wildlife as you 'fly' at sea level past the rugged coastlines bordering Revillagigedo Channel. Enter the Behm Canal, surrounded by the pristine beauty of Misty Fjords. Stop to view a bald eagle's nest and a Tlingit pictograph. Admire New Eddystone Rock, an immense volcanic spire rising from the sea.

You'll explore Rudyerd Bay, an ice-carved masterpiece deep within the Monument. Learn the natural history of the fjords while gliding quietly beneath 3,000 foot vertical cliffs. Feel the mist of glistening waterfalls and listen to the call of seabirds nesting on a rock face sculpted by glacial forces. Cruise south from Rudyerd Bay to view a gathering of harbor seals, and enjoy a selection of complimentary snacks and beverages while watching for other species of wildlife that thrive here. En route to Ketchikan, you'll have the opportunity to experience native culture and history presented by a Tlingit storyteller, watch a native artist at work, or enjoy a tour related video presentation.

Note: Be sure to bring a warm, rainproof jacket to wear on the topside observation deck, as this tour operates in all weather conditions. Wildlife sightings are frequent, but not guaranteed. Wheelchair access may be limited - for details, please consult your Shore Excursion staff before booking.

SAXMAN NATIVE VILLAGE & LUMBERJACK SHOW

Ketchikan, Alaska Tour Code: KTN_29

Become absorbed in the rich culture of Southeast Alaska's Native Americans and witness a rip roaring lumberjack competition on this comprehensive tour of Ketchikan. Your first stop will be a visit to Saxman Native Village. For generations, Tlingit villages have maintained a tradition of welcoming visitors in regal style. In this Native community, tribal elders and others have worked hard to pass on many of the traditions that have long defined their culture. A short video program will introduce you to their culture and history, then enter the Beaver Clan House where you'll be welcomed by song and dance. Visitors are encouraged to participate in the final dance before moving onto the Saxman Totem Park, one of the largest gatherings of totem poles in the world.

The next stop is the Village Carving Center where world famous carvers work and pass on their skills to eager apprentices. Visit the Village Store to purchase some of the finest Native Alaska art available. On the return trip, see sights of Creek Street and let the fun begin with a stop at the Great Alaska Lumberjack Show. Hardy lumberjacks bring to life Alaska's colorful forest history with an action packed competition in the partially

covered and heated outdoor arena. Cheer on your team of world champion lumberjacks in events such as chopping, sawing, tree climbing and much more.

Note: Please note that there may be a short wait prior to the Lumberjack Show. Time can be spent on your own or in the rustic company store located at the Lumberjack Show. Tour may operate in reverse. Maximum combined weight for guests with a wheelchair or scooter is 500 lbs. Wear layered waterproof attire. Umbrellas available for guest comfort.

RAINFOREST CANOPY ADVENTURE & ZIPLINE EXPEDITION

Ketchikan, Alaska Tour Code: KTN_32

Imagine the thrill of gliding through the top of a rich rainforest canopy along a series of dual cable zip lines and aerial bridges suspended between tall spruce, hemlock and cedar trees. Your professionally trained guides will outfit you with state of the art safety equipment and provide a detailed orientation, prior to mounting the first platform. Your rainforest canopy challenge features a flight over 8 ziplines and 3 suspension bridges. Progressively ease into the forest canopy along cables ranging from a short 100 feet to the 800 foot pulse pounding "Ben's Revenge".

Discover Eagle Creek falls and cross 3 hanging sky bridges offering views of the virgin forest below. You'll be up to 135 feet above the forest floor offering fantastic wildlife viewing chances. Gear down at base camp and receive a custom cast Alaska Canopy Adventures medal, in recognition of your achievement. Upon completion of this once in a lifetime experience, enjoy a complimentary snack, view your photograph, shop in the general store and take the opportunity to visit Alaska Wildlife's Reindeer and Raptor Center Exhibits before returning to town.

Note: Participants must weigh at least 90 lbs. and no more than 250 lbs. Minimum height is 5 feet. All guests must be in general good health and have full use of their limbs. Pregnant women and those with a history of seizure disorders should not participate. All guests must wear closed toe shoes. No video cameras allowed while zipping.

BEAR CREEK ZIPLINE

Ketchikan, Alaska Tour Code: KTN_56

A rainforest adventure for those seeking excitement and exhilaration! Bear Creek features eight ziplines, 10 tree platforms and two rappelling elements. Your adventure begins with a ride up the steep hillside in a custom all-terrain 4x4 Mercedes Unimog, to the outfitting chalet. After outfitting and an orientation, it's an uphill hike via a rainforest trail to a ground-based practice zipline, where your guides will introduce you to zipping. This is

your introduction to 5,600 feet of dual cable ziplines, providing an aerial view of Bear Creek and a forest waterfall.

You'll zip from platform to platform surrounded by tall stands of spruce, hemlock and cedar and down to the ground after the final zip. Board the Unimog for a forest hillside descent and transportation to the base camp, where you'll be presented with a special award in recognition of your achievement. View your action photograph, shop in the general store and take the opportunity to visit the Alaska Raptor Center's exhibits at your leisure before departure for the dock.

Note: Participants must be a minimum height of 50 inches, in good physical condition, weigh between 70 lbs. and 250 lbs. and have full use of limbs. Pregnant women and guests with injuries/seizure disorders are not admitted. Completion of a waiver form is required. Closed-toe shoes are required.

RAINFOREST ROPES & CHALLENGE PARK

Ketchikan, Alaska Tour Code: KTN_31

Board your motorcoach for a scenic 25 minute drive to Knudson Cove, a private waterfront estate in the Tongass National Forest. Upon arrival, guides will instruct and outfit you with safety equipment in an open air forest pavilion. Your adventure begins as you ascend into the trees and gravity pulls you along the ziplines. Nestled on a platform in the park, keep an eye out for eagles and ocean views.

You can take an optional challenge route that leads you across swinging logs and rope bridges. Feel the speed and acceleration of the ocean zip, where you'll land above the water on a freestanding platform. Then take the final zip to the taproom deck where you can have a free Alaskan brewed beer if you're 21 or older.

If you choose to skip the taproom, take the UTV up the hill to the 50 foot climbing tower where guides will show you techniques to climb to the top and safely auto belay to the ground. For those that are less adventurous, guides can assist you in skipping elements if you choose. You'll complete five to nine ziplines, with time to shop for souvenirs before returning to the pier.

Note: Participants must be at least 9 years of age, weigh a minimum of 60 lbs. and maximum of 270 lbs. Not recommended for pregnant women or those who have back, neck or spinal conditions. Wear closed-toe shoes.

BERING SEA CRAB FISHERMAN'S TOUR

Ketchikan, Alaska Tour Code: KTN_44

Join an adventure of a lifetime aboard the Aleutian Ballad, as seen on Discovery Channel's - The Deadliest

Catch. Your experience begins with a short walk along the fishing pier of Ketchikan, a historic fishing port and the gateway to Alaska. On board you'll find comfortable, heated theater style seating and modern amenities. As you head out on the calm waters of the Inside Passage, your seasoned crew will begin fishing and you'll be up close to all the action! Crabs, octopus, eels, sharks, rockfish and prawns are all a possibility, as the crew demonstrates their expertise.

Be on the lookout for whales, eagles, porpoise, and seals along the way. Admire the scenic beauty that surrounds you as the crew haul and set long line, barrel pots and huge king crab pots to reveal the catch of the day. The amazing marine life is placed in an on-deck aquarium so everyone can get up close look. This educational and interactive experience is perfect for all ages and is packed with stories and adventures shared by the men and women who risk their lives fishing the Bering Sea.

Note: Participants must be at least 5 years of age. This tour does not go out into the rough waters of the open ocean, it remains in the protected waters of the Inside Passage. Guests should dress comfortably in layers and wear closed-toed shoes. Bring a camera, credit card or cash for onboard shopping. Cell phone use is discouraged.

RAINFOREST ISLAND ADVENTURE

Ketchikan, Alaska Tour Code: KTN_26

A rainforest walk with a twist, your adventure starts aboard a motorized inflatable Seahawk, for the short but exciting cruise along the coast of Clover Passage. Along the way, you may have the opportunity to observe whales, Steller sea lions, harbor seals, bald eagles and migrating seabirds. Landing at a secluded beach, you'll follow your guide through the ancient Tongass National Forest, home to a diverse cross section of animals including bears, eagles, wolves and trumpeter swans.

You'll see Western Red Cedars and Alaskan Yellow Cedars that early Natives depended on for spiritual enrichment, shelter and transportation. The well-maintained trail is mostly boardwalk and about one mile in length. You'll also enjoy an interactive beach life interpretation by your naturalist guide. After hiking the historic route, enjoy an Alaskan-style snack, before returning to Ketchikan.

Note: Participants must weigh at least 40 lbs. and be in moderate to good physical condition. This trail has a gradual slope and is well maintained. Pregnant women in their 3rd trimester are not permitted. Life jacket and rain gear tops and bottoms are provided. Wear warm, comfortable clothing and walking shoes. Bring your camera and binoculars. Restroom facilities are limited. This tour operates under a Special Use Permit issued by the US Forest Service.

WILDERNESS EXPLORATION & CRAB FEAST

Ketchikan, Alaska Tour Code: KTN_10

Explore Alaska's wilderness by boat and enjoy a crab feast at George Inlet Lodge. As you leave the cruise ship dock your motorcoach driver will narrate as you pass an old sawmill, totem poles and scenic waterfalls. Arrive at the lodge and meet your Captain and crew as you board the boat. Big windows and a heated cabin will ensure your comfort. Cruise up the inlet while exploring the history and natural beauty of the region. View an old fish cannery, the site of an old gold mine, snowcapped mountains, and 2,000 foot waterfalls.

Wildlife often visit the area in search of food. Make sure to volunteer to help pull crab pots, see them up close, and learn about their anatomy and life cycle before returning them to the ocean. Return to the lodge to enjoy a tasty Dungeness crab feast! Be sure to save some room for blueberry cheesecake! Following your meal, your tour wraps up with a scenic motorcoach trip en route to the cruise ship dock. Tour may run in reverse order.

ALASKA LODGE ADVENTURE & SEAFEAST

The Alaskan Lodge Adventure & Seafeast tour combines 3 unique activities into one exciting and delicious expedition! Board your motor coach and enjoy a narrated tour en route to Clover Pass Resort, the oldest continuously operated fishing resort in the state. You'll board an adventure boat and head out in search of local wildlife. Visit an eagle's nest, visit the area where acoustic testing of US submarines takes place, watch for salmon, porpoise, seals, and other marine life and learn about life on the island. Your final stop is Silverking Lodge, located in the heart of Grant Island State Marine Park.

At the lodge you'll check out the day's catch, walk the elevated boardwalk into the heart of the rainforest and take your picture next to the largest known red cedar in the Tongass National Forest. Finish off your tour with a delectable seafood boil meal - crab, shrimp, clams, mussels, potatoes, onions, garlic, corn and sausage all cooked in one delicious pot! Use your last few minutes to take photos or soak up the incredible atmosphere, possibly happening across the resident Sitka blacktail deer population fond of frequenting the lodge grounds. A short boat ride back to Clover Pass Resort and a motor coach transfer back to the cruise ship dock will end your incredible adventure. Tour may run in reverse order.

Discover Misty Fjords National Monument, the nation's second largest wilderness region. Slowly crafted by nature over tens of thousands of years, it spans over a two million acre remote area. Board an authentic Alaskan floatplane and soar along the Ketchikan waterfront of Tongass Narrows then ascend to this monument that offers dramatic sights of sheer granite cliffs, waterfalls and glacial lakes. The specially equipped floatplanes offer all the amenities to make your trip a memorable experience, including digital CD audio systems and headsets to listen to the narration and music.

Midway through your flight, your pilot will land on a pristine lake or the saltwater inlet of Misty Fjords so that you can appreciate the incredible scenery of this wilderness while standing on the floats of the plane. Eagles, bears, mountain goats, whales and sea lions are some of the wildlife you may observe from your guaranteed window seat. You'll be given a souvenir route guidebook that will help you identify landmarks and highlights, and provide you with a memento of your trip. Bring your camera to capture the remarkable beauty of Misty Fjords.

At the end of the trail you'll be impressed by the large collection of totem poles that your driver/guide will bring to life for you. Through entertaining stories and narrative you'll learn about the culture and lifestyles practiced by the northwest coastal Natives and have a chance to enter into an authentic Native clan house. During your brief stop at the quaint Alaska Totem Trading store, you'll have an opportunity to shop and view beautifully carved totems along with a collection of vintage automobiles. Returning to town, catch a glimpse of Ketchikan's colorful past as you drive past Creek Street, the historic red light district.

Finally, it's time to enjoy the 'The Great Alaskan Lumberjack Show'! Hardy lumberjacks gather in this partially covered and heated outdoor arena, to compete in various logging events for you. Crowd favorites like log rolling, ax-throws and speed-climbing events will bring you out of your seat, as you cheer your lumberjack on. Many world champion athletes, as seen on ESPN and the Travel Channel, spend their summers in Ketchikan and will be performing in this great show.

RAINFOREST SANCTUARY & LUMBERJACK SHOW

Ketchikan, Alaska Tour Code: KTN_67

Start your adventure at the Great Alaska Lumberjack Show. Here, hardy lumberjacks bring to life Alaska's colorful forest history with an action packed competition in the partially covered and heated outdoor arena. Cheer on your team of world champion lumberjacks in events such as chopping, sawing, tree climbing and more. Next, board your coach for a narrated scenic drive to Herring Cove. Upon arrival, you'll be greeted by a naturalist who will guide you along improved trails into the dense forest, for a chance to see wildlife in their natural habitat. The sanctuary borders the Tongass National Forest. Stroll through tall stands of hemlock, spruce and Alaska cedar, stopping at viewing areas to photograph this natural wonderland.

The forest trail leads to an elevated boardwalk overlooking Eagle Creek where, during spawning season, salmon runs attract eagles, bears, seals and shorebirds. Bears and seals feed on the salmon while eagles and other birds wait for the scraps. Seasonal changes in the ecosystem result in varying levels of animal sightings. Next, meet and feed Alaska reindeer and take pictures with these gentle creatures. Watch a master Native carver at work on totem poles, walk through the historic Herring Bay Lumber Company sawmill and photograph bald eagles up close at the Alaska Wildlife Foundation exhibit. Browse through the general store and enjoy a snack before returning to your cruise ship pier.

Note: Wheelchair access may be limited – for details, please consult your Shore Excursion staff. Wear comfortable walking shoes and warm clothing. Wildlife sightings are not guaranteed and are more frequent in midsummer. Please note that there may be a short wait prior to the Lumberjack Show. LIGHTHOUSE, TOTEMS & EAGLES EXCURSION

Your excursion begins as you board your motorcoach for a scenic, narrated drive through Ketchikan to Air Marine Harbor. This tour has earned the "Tour Guide of the Year" award for each each of the past 10 years. It features guaranteed abundant eagles, 10 eagles nests, Totem Bight State Park, Vallenar Rocks Wildlife Viewing Area and historic Guard Island Lighthouse. Enjoy wildlife viewing with binoculars provided to you including: Eagles, Harbor seals, Pigeon Guillemots, moon jellyfish, whales, deer, blue heron and a variety of sea birds, all seen through the entire season. Enjoy the heated main cabin or outdoor observation decks.

You'll cruise past historic Ward Cove Cannery and circumnavigate the Guard Island Lighthouse established in 1901. No other excursion offers this itinerary, nor offers a view of Totem Bight State Park from the water. You'll view the Totem Bight clan house totem poles, including Ketchikan's tallest totem pole. Your Captain will unravel historic mysteries of Alaska's Danger Island and you'll circumnavigate or have clear view of a total of 12 islands on your tour route. Many of these islands are inhabited only by Alaska's wildlife. Enjoy complimentary "Hot Chocolate Supreme", coffee, tea, water, soft drinks as well as salmon spread, cheese, crackers, fresh fruit, cookies and mints.

TOTEM BIGHT STATE PARK & KETCHIKAN HIGHLIGHTS

Begin your journey with a scenic drive along the Tongass Narrows en route to Totem Bight State Park, home to one of the world's largest stand of totems. Immerse yourself in the beauty of the Tongass National Rainforest as you stroll under the canopy of majestic hemlock and cedar trees. Through lively stories and narrative, you'll learn about the culture and lifestyle practiced by the Northwest Coastal Natives. You'll also have an opportunity to enter a traditional Native clan house to see how they lived first hand. Prior to departing the park, you'll have a chance to photograph a magnificent collection of totem poles located in a picturesque setting.

During a brief stop at the quaint Alaska Totem Trading store, you'll have an opportunity to shop and view beautifully carved totems along with a collection of vintage automobiles and guns. While travelling back to the pier, you will be engaged with an entertaining city tour and learn of the industries which built Ketchikan and helped to make it the "Salmon Capital of the World". You may opt to disembark at Ketchikan's historic red-light district, Creek Street, or return to your ship. Order of tour may vary.

NATURE SANCTUARY, EAGLE CENTER & TOTEMS

Ketchikan, Alaska Tour Code: KTN_04

This eco-exploration includes a guided nature hike, a Native totem carver, raptor center and a historic sawmill at an exclusive reserve located in the forested mountains at rustic Herring Cove. This pristine natural environment is home to bald eagles, black bear, seals and a variety of birds and other species attracted by the major salmon runs in the abundant marine estuary. A naturalist will guide you along a trail through the heart of the dense forest, among tall stands of hemlock, spruce and Alaska cedar, stopping at strategically located viewing areas.

At a protected, open estuary, you'll follow Eagle Creek along an elevated wooden boardwalk overlooking grassy wetlands. Major runs of salmon return to spawn here. Listen to the symphony of bird activity in this spectacular setting. Seasonal ecosystem changes result in varying levels of wildlife activity. Other life you might see are humpback whales, sea lions and orca or maybe an eagle catching a salmon from the water! Black bears and wolves have been sighted here. Upon arrival guides will greet you and present a thorough but quick orientation. Get into your double kayak and launch onto the water. Practice your strokes as you approach the sheltered islands. No paddling experience is necessary. The tour is operated for a limited number of guests under special use permit with the US Forest Service.

Your caravan of karts sets out to explore the remote back country along several miles of forest trail, with your guide in the lead ATV.

Feel the rush of adrenaline at the start of your journey as you navigate an obstacle course in a custom designed Tomcar that tests your ability to traverse through the remaining wilderness. A comfortable pace is maintained as you thread your way around steep curves, climbing to reveal unparalleled views of the Tongass National Forest, Behm Canal and Alaska's fabled Inside Passage. Stops are made along the way to soak up the grandeur and beauty of this lush land. Enjoy a snack and beverage, then drivers and passengers have the opportunity to switch positions for the return trip. Be prepared to watch for wildlife along the way where eagles, deer or bears are frequently sighted.

Note: Participants must be at least 50" tall and weigh between 40 and 300 lbs. All drivers must provide a valid driver's license. Karts accommodate two guests. At the north end of town there are attractions that can include - a drive through the Ward Lake area of the Tongass National Forest. Ward Lake is lined with Sitka spruce, western hemlock and red cedar trees. While at Ward Lake guests may wish to hike along Ward Creek Trail. Lunch Creek Trail is located at the very north end of Tongass Highway. This is a moderate to more difficult, 4.1 mile trail that begins by winding through mature cedar and spruce forest, transitioning into natural tread interspersed with boardwalk climbing through spruce stands and muskeg meadows and ending in a sub-alpine forest at Emery Tobin Lake. Scenic views include a trailside waterfall. For bit of off-roading, you can go up Slide Mountain for a climb in elevation of approximately 1,100 feet to a private vista viewpoint. Custom stops can include but are not limited to: shopping, dining or exploring just about anything on the island. Wildlife stops can be made at any time the opportunity arises.

Groups will be given a separate coordinate to start the hunt and you'll be searching for your treasure on the beach and along a well maintained boardwalk trail through a beautiful old growth rainforest.

Each cache discovered will reveal coordinates for the next cache until the ultimate destination cache is found. Your guide will meander among the groups to assist as needed and provide interesting information about the native botanic species and the importance of the forest to the early Natives of the region. Once your group has found its treasure, you'll gather around a campfire and enjoy an Alaskan style snack before returning back to your ship.
