WHITE PASS RAILWAY, KLONDIKE GOLD FIELDS & PANNING

Don't miss this golden opportunity to experience the Klondike's rich past on this historical railway and dredge tour. In Skagway, you'll board the White Pass and Yukon Route Railroad. Once aboard your old-fashioned parlor car, you'll retrace the original route through rugged terrain beyond the summit of White Pass and Fraser, British Columbia. You'll journey down the west side of White Pass Canyon to Skagway via motorcoach. A stop at Tormented Valley and Pitchfork Falls provide picturesque valley views.

This guided tour complete with colorful characters, provides a unique opportunity to explore a massive gold dredge formerly used in the Klondike Gold Fields. This 350 ton machine is one of over 120 that operated in the north, and today stands as a monument to the gold rush seekers of the past century. You'll have a chance to try your hand at gold panning, with gold guaranteed in every pan! The Gold Shack staff will weigh your gold and fashion a memorable keepsake for purchase. On your return to Skagway, you may either stop for shopping or return directly to the ship.

It is off to the historic and magnificent White Pass Train adventure. From an antique parlor car, enjoy the incredible scenery while your tour guide shares the stories and history of the Klondike Gold Rush. Upon reaching Fraser, British Columbia board your motorcoach and take a short trip to the Yukon Suspension Bridge. Then it's time to experience the country that you heard about! Breathe pristine air, taste wild berries in season, hear the roar of raging white water and thrill to the sensations of a swaying walkway over 60 feet above the rapids.

There are Tagish First Nation Staff and Elders to answer questions about the site. A variety of First Nations art pieces and crafts are available for purchase, as well. After your experience at the Yukon Suspension Bridge, you'll continue on your motorcoach for the journey down the west side of the White Pass Canyon. Listen as your driver/guide entertains you with stories of the stampeders who trekked through the pass in search of gold. You'll see picturesque points such as Tormented Valley and Pitchfork Falls as you head back to your ship.

Ride the rails in style, revisit the gold rush era, and experience the life of a prospector on this fun-filled family tour. In the comfort of your parlor car, a costumed escort "from 1898" will entertain you with stories of gold prospecting. The train follows the same route that thousands of prospectors trotted on foot in search of gold. Historical narration is provided by the White Pass & Yukon railroad crew as you witness the breathtaking panorama.

Transfer to a motorcoach for a short drive to the Klondike Gold Fields and be immersed in the wild history of the Klondike Gold Rush. The dredge master will acquaint you with the gold dredge, a 350 ton gold sifting machine brought back from the Klondike. Learn the art of gold panning and practice your technique in heated water. This excursion combines a trip over the Klondike Highway with a ride on the White Pass & Yukon Railroad, leaving you time for further exploration during your visit to Skagway. This tour is presented in multiple foreign languages simultaneously.

Your experience begins onboard a comfortable mini-bus whose large picture windows afford spectacular views as you travel through Skagway and north along the Klondike Highway up through the West White Pass in the St. Elias Range. This is the highest coastal range in the world, and one of North America's most scenic mountain roads. Your guide will tell a century's worth of White Pass stories, and there are plenty of landmarks along the way including Dead Horse Trail, the old Brackett Wagon Road, Pitchfork Falls and Moore Bridge. Photo opportunities of numerous glaciers and peaks abound.

Upon arrival at Fraser, British Columbia, you'll board a vintage narrow gauge railcar for your trip aboard the world famous White Pass & Yukon Railroad. The train takes you through the opposite side of the Pass, and down the other side of the canyon, with new breathtaking panoramas of mountains, glaciers, and waterfalls back down the grade to Skagway.

Note: All guests must carry a valid passport as this tour will be crossing both US and Canadian borders. Guests wear comfortable headphones that deliver GPS activated audio-cinematic tour narration in their chosen language. Learn about modern sled dog racing and Gold Rush history at the Klondike Gold Fields. Meet an authentic musher, who will provide a video presentation that introduces dogs of the Klondike Gold Rush and highlights winter runs of today. See the gear that is used for long distance races. You'll meet the team and watch the musher hook them up to a sled for a demonstration run. Afterwards, guests are invited to interact with the dogs and hold the puppies.

Layer up and enter the cold chamber to see and feel the effects of extreme cold in the 40 Below Experience. Seasoned prospectors will give you time to warm back up and then provide an entertaining lesson on gold panning techniques. Try your skills with a pan of pay dirt at warm-water troughs and have your gold weighed in the Gold Parlor and purchase a souvenir to display it in.

Feel the cold of the north with the 40-Below Experience. Layer up and enter a cold chamber with your guide to get a feel for what it's like at these ultra-low temperatures. Visit the brewery for a tour and see the brewing process. Choose to sample three homemade micro-brews or homemade root beer. At the Klondike Grill buffet you'll get a smoked barbecue lunch including wild Alaskan salmon, various meats, and side dishes. Get an inside look at the inner workings of the dredge. Learn the art of gold panning from a prospector in an entertaining and informative demonstration. Test your luck and practice your technique in heated water troughs. This wilderness expedition to the spectacular Davidson Glacier leads you through fjords, rain forests, colorful wildflowers, and towering mountains. Your adventure begins with a 75 minute journey through North America's deepest fjord aboard a high speed 26 passenger expedition boat. Watch for whales, seals, sea lions, and cascading waterfalls along the way to a remote beach at Glacier Point, one of the most beautiful places in Alaska.

After a short, adventurous drive across the forested glacial moraines, and a quarter mile walk, the forest suddenly opens to a breathtaking view of the glacier. The crystal blue ice tumbles from the jagged peaks into a pristine lake where 12 passenger, 31 foot voyager canoes wait to take you to the very face of the glacier. Throughout your tour, expert guides share their extensive knowledge of this amazing area. Fast, fun, and exhilarating, this adventure is sure to excite nature lovers and thrill seekers alike. Get a running start on solid ground and take flight into the treetops of the Alaskan rainforest. Enjoy an entertaining tour through historic Skagway and along stunning coastline to Dyea. After you suit up in gear that meets the highest safety standards, your guide will explain how to safely navigate the course.

Then clip in and fly away through a course of 11 ziplines and 4 suspension bridges. And this is more than just any zip course, these lines will bring you directly above glacially fed waterfalls. This course also includes specialty lines such as "The Pipeline," that's longer than two football fields combined, and "The Big Kahuna," on which you can reach speeds of 45 miles per hour. GLACIER DISCOVERY BY HELICOPTER

Experience the infinite beauty of Alaska's remote glaciers! A short drive brings you to the heliport where, following a safety video, you'll be outfitted with boots and vests. Lift off from the historic Skagway waterfront and head into a rugged region of sheer mountains, majestic valleys and massive glaciers. Jagged peaks towering over the Chilkat Glacier, cascading waterfalls surrounding the Ferebee Glacier, or the spectacular "river of ice" known as the Meade Glacier, may be among the wonders you'll encounter.

Upon arrival at your glacial destination you'll have the rare opportunity to explore one of Mother Nature's greatest marvels. Enjoy a walking exploration of the river of ice, while experienced glacier guides answer your questions and explain the awesome forces at work.

Note: Flight routes and landing zones are selected daily based on the weather forecast to ensure that you will see the best sights. Tour includes approximately 40 minutes of helicopter time and 40 minutes on the glacier. Glacier boots, trekking pole and safety vest are provided. Guests should wear comfortable shoes and dress in warm layers. Hat, gloves and sunglasses are recommended. No canes, crutches, go-pro sticks or any extendable devises are allowed on helicopter. No carry-on bags, i-pads or tablets are allowed.

SAWTOOTH MOUNTAIN HIKE & WHITE PASS RAILWAY

Skagway, Alaska Tour Code: SGY 19

This fully guided wilderness hike begins with a brief 20 minute train ride aboard the Historic White Pass and Yukon Route Railway. You'll ride through the wilderness to the Denver Valley trailhead located in the Tongass National Forest. Your hiking guide will accompany you through the dense coastal rainforest filled with oldgrowth trees, moss beds, and other flora. On your 3 to 5 mile hike, the trail occasionally intersects with the raging Skagway River and lookout points provide spectacular views of the Sawtooth Mountain Range.

The hike can be done as a casual stroll through the forest or as a more aggressive hike, depending on your preference. There's plenty of opportunity for photography and there is potential for wildlife sightings. Bear, moose, and mountain goats all call this valley home. Guides will provide information about the region's natural and gold rush history. Enjoy a refreshment before boarding the train for your return trip to town.

Note: Participants must be at least 9 years of age and in good physical condition. Dress in layers and wear sturdy walking shoes. The train returns from Canada, all participants are required to carry a valid passport. Tour duration includes approximately three hours (3 to 5 miles) on the trail.

DENVER VALLEY WILDERNESS HIKE & WHITE PASS RAIL

Skagway, Alaska Tour Code: SGY_85

This trip combines a 27.7 mile White Pass Railway ride with a 4 to 6 mile round-trip wilderness hike toward Denver Falls, in lush old growth forest. After a 22 mile bus ride, your rail journey will be broken into two parts, before and after the hike. This world renowned railway adventure carries you through the scenic White Pass

complete with waterfalls, rushing rivers, trestles, and tunnels as you trace the trail of '98. This southbound trip offers outstanding views from Inspiration Point and other locations along the route. After disembarking at Denver Station, your professional guides will lead you through the glacially carved valley full of dense, old growth forest.

The trail traces the raging East Fork of the Skagway River, meeting it intermittently and providing excellent photo opportunities. Be alert, and keep your camera close, as the remote valley is home to bears and other wildlife. From the depths of the river valley, gaze at the magnificent craggy peaks of the Sawtooth Mountains that make this valley deeper than the Grand Canyon. Your narrated hike will introduce you to the flora, fauna and history that make the region unique. Hiking through the pristine Tongass National Forest with 1,000 year old trees with photo stops by the river and Denver Falls will highlight this perfect mix of exercise and natural beauty. After the hike, continue with your return train ride to Skagway.

Note: Passport required. Participants must be at least 9 years of age. Dress in layers and wear walking or athletic shoes. Small lumbar pack, trekking pole, rain gear, extra warm layers, hats, gloves, snow shoes, bug repellent and sun block provided. Lunch and snacks provided.


CHILKOOT LAKE FRESHWATER FISHING

A mix of lures and bait are used to entice the Dolly Varden, Sockeye, and Pink Salmon on this one of a kind excursion. Keep a look out for wildlife, including majestic bald eagles and brown bears that make this picturesque valley home.
