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# Agadir Berber Market & Fantasia Show - AG10

We depart the pier towards our first stop, Oufala Kasbah. From viewpoint, a short drive down the hill brings you to the Talborjt Mosque. Depart the Mosque to Fantasia Inezgane, where you will be welcomed by singers in keeping with Moroccan hospitality. Be ready for a rare treat-a horse race run by horsemen in traditional costumes. Next stop is the Berber market of SOUK AL HAD. After an opportunity to practice your bartering skills, we return to the coach for our homeward journey via downtown.

Take a scenic drive to a Moroccan folkloric show and captivating horse race, followed by a visit to the colorful Berber market of Souk El Had. Sip Moroccan tea with mint under a Berber tent as you watch a local musicians and dancers perform for you, followed by a traditional horse race, an event deeply rooted in Moroccan culture. Then practice your bartering skills at Souk El Had, the largest open-air marketplace in the region.

#### **Highlights:**

- Scenic drive: Begin your half-day tour with a view of the Kasbah, built in 1505 to defend against Portuguese invaders.
- Fantasia Show: Enjoy a show under Berber tents, featuring traditional Berber dancing, nimble acrobatics and music from local folkloric bands.
- Souk El Had: Like a bazaar, a souk is an open-air marketplace. Agadir's souk is the largest in the region.

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# Agadir Souk & Medina of Ancient Taroudant - AG12

See the splendors of Agadir, plus explore the souk and medina of Taroudant, a historic market town along the "caravan route." Along your way to Agadir's Kasbah, renowned for its breathtaking view over an almost endless beach. Then discover Taroudant, once the capital of the Saadi Dynasty. Stop for photos at the city ramparts, heading through the walls to the medina and souk, the open-air marketplace known for its jewelry and carpets.

- Kasbah: A Kasbah is an older quarter of a city and is often where the citadel is located.
- Taroudant: The first sultan of the Saadi Dynasty built the city walls, great mosque and minaret in 1528.
- Medina: A medina is walled, pedestrian-only section of a city, featuring narrow, maze-like streets, fountains, palaces and mosques.

Enjoy a scenic drive to Taroudant, once the capital of the Saadi Dynasty. Stop for photos at the city ramparts, heading through the walls to the medina and souk, the open-air marketplace. Taroudant, a market town along the "caravan route," prospered from the trade of sugar cane, cotton, rice and indigo. Today, it's known for its jewelry and carpets and a much more relaxed purchasing atmosphere. After, enjoy local Moroccan tea and pastries.

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# Panoramic Agadir City Drive - AG06
