Manta, Ecuador

Manta is your gateway to Ecuador and its capital, Quito. Founded in 1534, Quito is one of the best-preserved cities in South America, boasting superb 16th- and 17th-century Baroque architecture including Convents and Churches which include the first major religious structure built in the New World. In 1978, Quito and Krakow, Poland were the first World Heritage Sites to be designated by UNESCO.

Ecuador possesses one of the world's most varied terrains. To the west of Manta lie the Galapagos Islands. To the east rises the great rampart of the Andes.

Note: Manta offers little in the way of tourist infrastructure. Transportation and tour guides are imported to the area. Despite the sometimes hot and humid conditions there is no guarantee of air-conditioned vehicles..

Points of Interest

Quito

Ecuador's well-preserved capital and one of the world's first UNESCO World Heritage Sites, Quito boasts a wealth of South American history as well as phenomenal views of the Andres

Independence Square

Surrounded by historic buildings, including palaces, cathedrals and hotels, this pristine landscaped square has been the center of Quito since the early 17th century.

Church of Santo Domingo

With elaborate murals adorning its walls, this 17th-century church is perhaps most treasured for a sculpture of the Virgin Mary that was given to the church by Charles V of Spain.

Artisan Market

Where several handicrafts are found

Montecristi

Birthplace of the popular Panama hat, this small town is nestled at the base of Montecristi Hill, here you will have the chance to find the handicrafts of local artisans

1 Ivory Nut Factory

Discover the art of cultivating and carving ivory-like tropical palm nuts called taguera into intricate souvenirs and buttons.

Pacoche Wildlife Refuge

Stretching out over 27 acres within the Pacoche Forest, the reserve is home to a large variety of flora and fauna including howler monkeys, hummingbirds, orchids and ornamental plants.

Archaeological Museum

The Museum features pre-Columbian artifacts. The archaeological permanent exposition shows components that chronologically illustrates the cultural background of the region.
